

Parish of Stannullin, County of Meath
Copy of certificate of composition in lieu of Tithes.

I Francis Robert Cotton, commissioner, duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the second, and third year of his Majesty King William the fourth, entitled, "an Act to amend three Acts, passed respectively, in the fourth, fifth, and in the seventh, and eighth, years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth, providing for the establishing of compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such compositions permanent." - To ascertain, and fix, a true and just composition for all Tithes, arising, growing, yielded, or payable, within the parish of Stannullin, aforesaid, in the County of Meath. I do hereby certify, that the true and just amount of composition for all Tithes whatever within the said parish is Four hundred and twenty five pounds sterling by the year - of which sum of Four hundred and twenty five pounds - Three hundred, and fifty pounds sterling are due and payable, to William Cotton Pollard Esquire, and his Lessee, George Pepper Esquire, as a composition claimable by them as Tithe owners to be paid out of all that part of said parish, where he (the said Mr. Cotton Pollard Esq; and his Lessee) has hitherto received Tithes.

And Seventy five pounds sterling, are due and payable, to the Rev. William Vandelaar, Vicar of said parish, as aforesaid, as a composition for the Tithes, claimable by him as vicar of the said parish, to be paid out of all that part of said parish, where he as such Vicar has hitherto received Tithes.

And I do further certify, that the average price of wheat being the corn principally grown in said county, for the period of seven years, ending on the first day of November 1830, is one pound, twelve shillings, and one halfpenny per Barrel.
