 Virtue of an act Made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth and an
 Amendment of the fifth year of the Reign of King George the fourth Entitled an act
 for a composition of Tithes in Ireland for a limited time, to ascertain and fix a true
 and just composition for the Vicarial Tithes arising Growing and yielding or payable
 in the Parish of Howcarty in the County of Kilkenny and Diocess of Ossory, do Certify
 That the true and just amount of Composition for the Vicarial Tithes within said
 Parish is Thirty five Pounds Eight Shillings and five pence by the year which sum is
 Due and Payable to the Reverend Thomas Reunis as a composition for the Tithes
 Claimable by him as Vicar of the Vicarial Tithes of said Parish, and we do further
 Certify that the foregoing written Pages of this Book contains our appointment for Levying
 Thirty five Pounds Eight Shillings and five pence by the year and Payable Halfe yearly as
 Afforesaid for the full and term of Twenty one years without any Variation of Prices of
 Grains Whatsoever. Dated this Twenty fifth Day of February 1825
