

I John Kidd Commissioner duly appointed and Sworn unto
 and by virtue of An Act made in the second and third years of His late
 Majesty King William the Fourth Entitled An Act to amend three Acts passed
 respectively in the fourth fifth and in the Seventh and Eighth years of the Reign
 of His Majesty King George the Fourth providing for the establishing of
 Compositions for tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent
 And by virtue of Another Act passed in the second and third years of Her
 Majesty Queen Victoria Entitled An Act to abolish Compositions for Tithes in
 Ireland and to substitute Rentscharges in lieu thereof to ascertain and fix a true
 and just Composition for all tithes arising growing yielded or payable within
 the Parish of Stancarty alias Stonecarty and County of Kilkenny (whereby
 being that the true and just amount of Composition for all tithes whosoever
 within the said Parish is nearly eight pounds one Shilling and ten pence
 Sterling by the year of which sum of nearly eight pounds one Shilling and ten
 pence two third parts (that is to say) the sum of Sixty five pounds seven Shillings
 and eleven pence are due and payable to the Vicar and Choral and Chorismen of
 Christ Church and Saint Patrick's Dublin as a Composition for the Rectorial tithes
 claimable by them one third part (that is to say) the sum of Twenty two pounds
 thirteen Shillings and eleven pence is due and payable to the Vicar of the said
 Parish for the time being -
