

WE, John Alliman of Eyrecoast and John Mahon of Kennece
Esquires in the County of Galway,
Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue
of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George
the fourth intituled an Act to provide for the Establishing
of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time,
to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for
all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the
Parish of Strabally in the County of Galway, do hereby
Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for
all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is One Hundred
and fifteen pounds ten Shillings Sterling ^{and} by the year of
which sum of One Hundred and fifteen pounds ten Shillings
Thirty one pounds ten Shillings Sterling, are due and
payable to John Burke as a Composition for the Tithes
claimable by him as Vicar of said Parish and his
successors - Twenty eight pounds seventeen Shillings
are due and payable to the Bishop of the Diocese of
Clonfert and his successors - Fifty five pounds two
Shillings and ten pence are due and payable
to Robert King as Archdeacon of Kilmacduagh, and
his successors. —

WE do further Certify
that the average price of oats being the Corn principally
grown in such County for the period of seven years
ending on the 1st day of November 1821 is ten Shillings
and six pence by the Barrel. —

of September 1826 us. —
