

I, ARTHUR MOORE MOSSE, being duly Appointed and Sworn Commissioner, under and by virtue of an act made in the Second and Third Years of the Reign of King WILLIAM the Fourth, Chapter 119, entitled an act to amend Three Acts passed respectively in the 4th, 5th 7th and 8th years of the Reign of his late Majesty, King GEORGE the Fourth, providing for the Establishment of Composition of Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent (16th August, 1833,) to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes Arising, Growing, Yielding, or Payable within the Parish of

Shanahally in the Queen's County, do certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever in said Parish is ~~£ two hundred and thirty~~ ^{seven} ~~and thirty~~ ~~shillings~~ ~~and~~ ~~seven~~ ~~pence~~ by the year, and that the said Sum of ~~£ two hundred and thirty~~ ^{seven} ~~and thirty~~ ~~shillings~~ ~~and~~ ~~seven~~ ~~pence~~ is payable to the Rev. *Robert Johnson* as a Composition for all Tithes, claimed by him as ^{Vicar} Rector of said Parish *of Shanahally*

and that the sum of one hundred and thirty eight pounds and shillings and seven pence half penny is payable to the representatives of the late John Bailey who was Lecturer of Trinity College in Dublin of said Parish

And I do further Certify that the average price of *Wheat* being the Corn principally grown in said County, for the period of seven years, ending the First of November, 1830, is *one* Pounds *twelve* Shillings, and *one* Pence ⁴/₂ per Barrel.
