Ordered by the Lord Lieutenant by and with the advice
and consent of the Privy Council of Ireland. And upon the
consent thereto of the parties appellants and Respondent
in this case given in open Court at the hearing of the said
appeal, by their respective Counsel. That the amount of
the Composition stated in the said Certificate as due and
payable to his grace the said most Noble William Spencer
Duke of Devonshire as a Composition for the Lay
Impropriate Tithes of the said Parish of St. Michael's be
decreased to the sum of Five Hundred Pounds and
that the amount of the whole of the Composition stated in
the said Certificate for the said Parish be decreased
to the sum of Seven hundred and Ninety five pounds
four Shillings and four Pence, And that throughout
the said Certificate when the Composition is declared
to be payable in the proportion of two thirds to the Lay
Impropriator and of one third to the Vicar. That the
Specification of said proportions be struck out of
the said Certificate. And it is hereby ordered that
the Entry of the said Certificate in the Registry
of the said Diocese be altered and amended
accordingly. And it is further ordered that the parties
appellant and Respondent in this case do respectively
bide their own Costs.
