is due and payable to the Reverend Doctor John Dorrington  
as a Composition for the remaining <sup>to be writ</sup> one third of the Tithes of  
said Parish claimable by him as Vicar thereof And I do  
further Certify that the Average price of Oats being the  
Corn principally given in such County for the period of  
seven years ending on the first of November One thousand  
eight hundred and thirty is twelve Shillings and eleven  
pence half penny per barrel, given under my hand this  
Eighth day of August one thousand eight hundred  
and thirty three - Thomas Edw and Wily Commissioners  
And Whereas an Appeal against the amount of the  
Composition stated in the said Certificate as due and  
payable to his grace the Duke of Devonshire for the Impropriate  
Tithes of the said Parish, has been duly made to the Lord  
Lieutenant of Ireland and Privy Council in the name of  
the Parishioners of the said Parish in Vestry assembled,  
and Notice of such Appeal having been duly given, the  
said Appeal in pursuance of an Order for that purpose  
came on to be heard in presence of Counsel learned in  
the Law appearing on behalf of the said Appellants and  
of the Respondent His grace William Spencer Duke of  
Devonshire as Owner of the Impropriate Tithes of the said  
Parish, And thereupon the said Appeal and Certificate  
and the Matter thereof having been heard, It is this Day  
that is to say Saturday the Twenty sixth Day of October  
One thousand eight hundred and thirty three
