duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in  
the second and third years of the reign of his Majesty King  
William the fourth, entitled "An Act to amend three Acts passed  
respectively in the fourth, fifth, and in the seventh and eighth  
years of his late Majesty King George the fourth, providing for  
the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make  
such compositions permanent" To ascertain and fix a true and  
just composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or  
payable within the Parish of Straffan, Diocese of Dublin and  
County of Kildare, I do hereby certify that the true and just a-  
mount of composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Par-  
ish is one Hundred and thirty pounds sterling by the year, of which  
sum of One Hundred and thirty pounds - Eighty pounds is due &  
payable to William Whitelaw Esq: as a composition for all  
Tithes claimable by him as Tithe owner in said Parish. And  
Fifty pounds is due and payable to the Rev: Rob: Pakenham, as  
a composition for all Tithes claimable by him as Vicar of said Parish.

And I do further certify that the average price of  
Wheat being the corn principally grown in said County for the  
period of seven years ending on the first day of November 1830. is  
one pound, twelve shillings and one halfpenny & Parcel.
