

J. Andrew Baker Commissioner duly appointed
and sworn, under, and by virtue of an Act of
Second and Third, William the Fourth intituled
an Act to amend three Acts passed respec-
tively in the Fourth Fifth and in the Seventh
and Eighth Years of the Reign of his late
Majesty King George the Fourth providing
for the establishing of Composition of Tithes
in Ireland; and to make such Composition
permanent, and to ascertain and fix a true
and just Composition for all Tithes arising
growing, yielded or payable within the Perpetual
Curacy of Glencorlor in the Parish of Mon-
orlor in the County of Donegal.

I do hereby Certify that the true and just
amount of Composition for all Tithes whatso-
ever within said Perpetual Curacy is
Two Hundred and Forty pounds, Sterling by
the year for Composition by Mutual agreement

And I do further Certify that the average
price of oats, being the Com principally grown
in said County, for the period of Seven Years,
ending on the first day of November the
Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty, is
about Ten Shillings and Sixpence Sterling
per Barrel
