

I Andrew Baker Tithe Commissioner duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act of Second and Third William the Fourth entitled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth Fifth and in the Seventh and Eighth years of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth providing for the establishing of Tithes in Ireland; and to make such Composition permanent, and to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising, growing yielded or payable within that portion of the Parish of Breunor attached to the Deanery of Raphoe. do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever within said Parish of said Parish of Breunor to be One Hundred and Twenty Pounds Sterling One Hundred pounds two shillings Sterling being the average of the seven years from 1824 to 1830 both inclusive. I have added twelve pounds eight shillings Sterling in consideration of the Tithes being set under their value. And I do further Certify that the average price of Oats being the Corn principally grown within said County for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty is Twelve shillings and Eleven pence Sterling per Barrel
