

We Richard Mauders of Brackinstown in the County of Dublin and John Arthur of Seaford in the County of Dublin Esquires Commissioners duly appointed and Sworn under and by Virtue of an act made in the Fourth year of King George the Fourth Intitled an act to provide for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time and also by Virtue of another act of Parliament made in the Fifth year of King George the Fourth Intitled an act to amend an act of the last session of Parliament for providing for the Establishing of Compositions for tithes in Ireland to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all tithes arising growing yielded or payable within that part of the Town and Liberty of Swords in the Parish of Swords and also in that part of the Parish of Swords in the County of Dublin which have been paid and are payable to the Vicar of Swords Do hereby Certify that the just and true amount of Composition for all tithes whatever within the said Liberty and Parish payable to the Vicar thereof is Two hundred and seventy Three pounds One Shilling and two pence the sum of £ 67. 3. 10¹/₂ is due and payable to the Rev^d Stewart Segar French as a Composition for the tithes claimable by him as Vicar of the said Parish and the sum of £ 12. 15. 5¹/₂ is due and payable to him as Lessee of the Very Rev^d the Dean and Chapter of St. Patricks Cathedral for certain tithes called the Petty Canons and also the sum of £ 95. 3. 10¹/₂ for certain other tithes called the Procles in the said Parish of Swords is also due and payable to him as Lessee of the Very Rev^d the Dean and Chapter aforesaid And we do further Certify that the several above
