

I Stephen Barry, Commissioner, duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act, passed in the Second and Third Years of the Reign of His Majesty, King William the Fourth, Intituled, "An Act, to amend three Acts, passed respectively, in the Fourth, Fifth and in the Seventh and Eighth years, of the Reign of His late Majesty, King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent" - to ascertain and fix, a true and just Composition, for all Tithes, arising, growing, yielded or payable, within that part of the Parish of Swords, called Sorrow, otherwise Sorrowes, otherwise Sorrow in the County of Dublin consisting of the Towns and Lands hereinafter named, to wit, The Towns and Lands of Rahangel, otherwise Raskings, Colcot, Forderstown and Achon Sorrowes, otherwise Great Sorrow - Do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever, within the said part of said Parish, is Fifty eight Pounds, Five Shillings and three pence Sterling, by the year. The entire of which sum of Fifty eight Pounds, Five Shillings and three pence $\text{£}58$, is due and payable to John Hill Esq^r, as Lessee of the Dean and Chapter of St Patricks Cathedral, Dublin, as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him, as Lessee of the Dean and Chapter aforesaid, the owners of the entire Tithes of said Part of said Parish. And I do further certify, that the price of wheat being the corn principally grown in such County, for the period of seven years, ending the first day of November, one Thousand eight Hundred and Thirty, is one Pound, Twelve Shillings and one half penny $\text{£}1$ 12s 1/2d, British per Barnell of Twenty Stone, as published in the Dublin Gazette.
