Against these 3 Bills Mr Irvine is to give credit to The Dean and Chapter for £38. 18. 11 amount of arrears of Fee Farm Rent received by him from Mr Ennis

In addition to this ^{Bills} Mr Irvine has furnished an account shewing the arrears of Little Kent Charge recovered by him for The Dean and Chapter from various parties amounting to £670. 5. 3 on which he claims a balance of £25. 0. 11 poundage at the rate of ½ in the pound in lieu of costs under an agreement to that effect entered into between him and The Dean and Chapter dated 10th May 1853

Mr Irvine has produced vouchers for the various sums stated to have been received and paid over by him to the late Sub-Proctor which I have accordingly allowed with the exception of £10. 19 poundage on a sum of £109. 11. 1 arrears of Kent charge payable out of the lands of Aghderig and recovered from the Earl of Essex inasmuch as this Kent Charge is the property of the Vicars Choral and was handed over to their late Steward, they should ^{therefore} of course pay the costs of the necessary proceedings to which The Dean and Chapter cannot be held liable. The deduction of this sum and of other credits allowed by Mr Irvine reduces the balance due him on foot of this account to £14. 1. 11


