

I John Colvora Surveyor having been appointed and sworn a Commissioner (under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and third years of the Reign of King William the fourth to amend and make permanent three acts made in the seventh and eighth years of the Reign of King George the fourth providing for the establishing of composition for Tithes in Ireland) to ascertain & fix a true and just composition for all tithes arising growing & payable within the Parish of Tubernshane in the County of Wexford and in the Diocese of Ferns

I do certify that the true and just amount of composition for all Tithes whatsoever in said Parish is Two hundred and twenty four pounds eighteen shillings and eleven pence parting Sterling by the year (According to the average of the seven years preceeding November 1830) are due and payable to the Rev. Chas. R. Briggs D.D. as a composition for the Tithes claimed by him as Rector of said Parish.

And I do further certify that the average price of Oats is twelve shillings and eleven pence half penny Sterling per barrel as taken from the Dublin Gazette for the seven years preceeding November 1830 being the common price of Oats grown in this County -
