

We, Francis Robert Cotton, of Prospect, in the County of Dublin, and George Wharton of Meadow Bank, in the said County, Esquires, Commissioners duly appointed and Sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, intituled, "An Act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time," and of an Act made in the fifth year of His said Majestys Reign, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act of the last Session of Parliament, for providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland," to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes, arising, growing, yielded, or payable, within the Parish of Tallaght, in the County of Dublin, do hereby Certify, that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever, within the said Parish, is Six hundred and seventy-eight pounds, eighteen shillings and six pence, British Currency, by the year, being equal in amount to the sum of seven hundred and thirty-five pounds, ten shillings, of the late Irish Currency. Of which sum of Six hundred and seventy-eight pounds, eighteen shillings and six pence Halfpenny, British Currency, being equal in amount to four hundred pounds, of the late Irish Currency, is due and payable, to the Honourable and very Reverend Richard Pursonby, Dean of the Cathedral, and Collegiate Church of St. Patricks, Dublin, and Rector of the said Parish of Tallaght as aforesaid, as a Composition for the Tithes Claimable by him as Rector of the said Parish, to be paid out of all that part of said Parish where he, as such Rector, has heretofore received Tithes.

And Two hundred and twenty-one pounds, ten shillings, and nine pence Halfpenny, British Currency, being equal in amount to two hundred and forty pounds, of the late Irish Currency, is due and payable to the Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral and Collegiate Church of St. Patricks, and their Lessees, as a Composition for the Tithes Claimable by the said Dean and Chapter in their corporate capacity, and their Lessees, out of all that part of said Parish, claimed by them the said Dean and Chapter, on the 14th day of March 1814, to Richard Lett, for the term of twenty-one years from the 29th of September then last past.

And eighty-eight pounds, three shillings and one penny, British Currency, being equal in amount to ninety-five pounds, ten shillings, of the late Irish Currency, is due and payable to the Revd. Thomas Goff, as Vicar of the said Parish.

And we do further Certify that the average price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in said County, for the period of seven years ending on the first of November 1821, is fifteen shillings and two pence farthing per barrel.
