for tithes in Ireland as also by virtue of an Act passed in the Seventh and
Eighth years of the Reign of his present Majesty entitled an Act to amend
the acts for establishing of composition for tithes in Ireland as aforesaid
(and for a time and part composition for tithes arising growing & accruing
& payable within the Parish of Churchtown in the County of Wiltshire)
Do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of composition for
all tithes to be taken within the said Parish is Three Hundred &
Twenty Pounds Sterling by the year of which sum of Three Hundred &
Twenty Pounds Two Shillings or Two Hundred and Twenty Pounds and
two shillings is due and payable to the Lay Rector as a composition for the tithes
claimable by them and the third or the Hundred & thirty pounds Sterling is due
and payable to the Rev^d John French Dean of Exeter as a composition
for the tithes claimable by him as Rector of said Parish to be continued
invariable for Twenty one years and we do further Certify that the
average price of Wheat being the one principally grown in such county
for the Period of seven years ending on the first day of November 1824
is Thirty Shillings of D. Bannister
