Act of Parliament and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the fourth intitled an Act to provide for the establishing of a composition for tithes in Ireland for a limited time ~~and by virtue of an Act made in the fifth year of the reign of King George the fourth intitled an Act to amend an Act of the last Session of Parliament for providing for the establishing of composition for tithes in Ireland to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all tithes arising growing yielding or payable within the Parish of Saint Michaels in the County of Meath~~

Do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of composition for all tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is one Hundred & twelve Pound sixteen Shillings & six pence by the year of which sum of one Hundred & twelve Pound sixteen Shillings & six pence two thirds or seventy five Pound six Shillings and four pence are due and payable to John Gray Esq as a composition for the tithes claimable by him as lay impropriator and one third or thirty seven Pound thirteen Shillings & two pence is due and payable to the Rev^d John French Dean of Elphin as a composition for the tithes claimable by him as Rector of the said Parish to be continued invariable for twenty one years — (And we do further Certify that the average Price of wheat being the Corn successively grown in such County for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November 1821 is thirty Shillings & Barrels
