

I Walter Keilly Esq<sup>r</sup> Commissioner duly appointed  
and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made  
in the second and third year of the reign of King  
William the fourth, entitled "An Act to amend  
three Acts passed respectively, in the fourth, fifth  
and in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of  
His late Majesty King George the fourth providing  
for the Enclosure of Compositions in Ireland  
and to make such Compositions permanent" I do  
ascertain and fix, a true and just Composition  
for all Tithes arising growing yielding or  
payable within the Parish of Bankendstown in  
the County and Diocese of Lincoln, Do  
hereby Certify that the true and just Amount  
of Compositions for all Tithes whatsoever within  
the said Parish is One Hundred and twenty  
five Pounds Sterling by the year, <sup>of which</sup>  
Sum of One Hundred and twenty five Pounds  
is due and payable to The Reverend James W<sup>m</sup>  
Forster, as a Composition for the Tithes claimed  
by him as Rector of the Rectorial and Vicarial  
Tithes. - And I do further Certify that the  
average Price of Wheat and Oats being the Corn  
principally grown in said County for the Period  
of seven years next preceding the 1<sup>st</sup> day of  
November 1830 is for Wheat One Pound twelve Shillings  
and one half penny per Barrel, and for Oats Eleven  
Shillings and Nine pence three farthings per Barrel
