a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing,
yielded or payable within the Parish of Tell-Town and County
of Meath do hereby certify that the true and just amount
of composition for all Tithes whatsoever, within said Parish
in addition to the certificate lodged October 1829 consisting
of threefourths of the Lands of Kilsinkham are leased to
Joseph Barnwell Esq. for a long term, and tithes free for
said Term, amounting to thirty three pounds eight shillings
and nine pence which sum is now due and payable to said
Joseph Barnwell, and at the expiration of said Lease, or term
unto and will be payable & due to Dominick O'Leary of
his Rent or Spize as a composition for the Tithes claimable
by him as lay-Impropriator of said Parish - And we do
further certify that the average price of oats being the corn
principally grown in such County for the period of seven years
ending on the 1st day of November one thousand eight hundred & twenty one
is fifteen shillings & two pence gathing (that currency) of bulk
