Amount of Composition for all Tithes shewen within the said
Parish of Ill-Town is Two Hundred and seventeen Pounds seventeen
Shillings & two pence Sterling by the year of which sum of
Two Hundred & seventeen Pounds seventeen Shillings & two pence
The sum of forty two pounds fourteen shillings & 9th Sterling is due and
payable to the Representative of the late Dr. Crawford Vincent as a
Composition for the Tithes claimable by the said Representative as
Lay Impropriator of one moiety of the Lands of Millmainham
and the remainder of said sum of Two Hundred and seventeen Pounds
seventeen Shillings & 9th being the Hundred & seventy four pounds two shillings & 5th Sterling
is due and payable to Dominick Kelly Esq. as a Composition
for the Tithes claimable by him as ^{the} Lay Impropriator of said
Parish -

And We do further certify that the average price of
Oats being the corn principally grown in said County for the
period of seven years ending on the twenty first day of
November Eighteen Hundred and twenty one is Fifteen Shillings & two
pence Sterling of said late currency -
