

I John Nicolson Gibson, Commissioner duly appointed and sworn
under and by Virtue of An Act made in the second and Third Years
of the Reign of His Present Majesty King William the Fourth,
Entituled An Act to Amend Three Acts, passed respectively in
the Fourth, Fifth, and in the seventh and eighth Years of the
Reign of His Late Majesty King George the Fourth providing
for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to
make such Compositions permanent, I ascertain and fix a true, and
just Composition for all Tithes, arising, growing, yielding, or payable,
within the Parish of Templebreedy, in the Diocese of Cork
and County of Cork. I do hereby Certify that the
true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever,
within the said Parish is, Two Hundred Pounds Sterling,
by the Year, of which sum of Two Hundred Pounds, the sum of One
Hundred Sixty Pounds Seven Shillings and Two pence, are due
and payable to His Very Rev^d the Dean of Cork, as a Composition
for the Tithes claimed by him as Rector of Parish, and the remain-
ing sum of Thirty Nine Pounds twelve Shillings Ten pence, is due,
and payable to, The Rev^d William Cotter Williamson, as, Perpetual
Curate of Parish, being the Amount of all Tithes, payable out of
The seven Lands of Woodstockfield, in said Parish, as allocated for
the payment of the Perpetual Curate of Parish, by Deed of
Endowment, bearing date the sixteenth day of June One Thousand
Eight hundred and Thirteen, and duly Enrolled in His Majesty's High
Court of Chancery, Under the Virtue of An Act, passed in the Kingdom
of Ireland in the Eleventh Year of the Reign of His late
Majesty King George the Third, Entituled An Act for Erecting
Parochial Charities of Ease, &c. Chapter Sixteenth. And I do further
Certify that the average price of Wheat, being the Corn principally
grown in such County for the period of seven Years ending the 1st Day of November
One thousand Eight hundred Thirtieth is One pound Twelve Shillings and Six half pence
per Barrel. Dated this thirty first day of October One thousand
