I John Plant Gaynor Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the Second and Third years of the reign of King William the Fourth entitled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth Fifth and in the Seventh and Eighth years of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth providing for the establishing a Composition for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Composition permanent, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Templeboden alias Dunmoyne in the County of Cork and Diocese of Cloyne, do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within said Parish is Three hundred and forty Eight pounds Seven Shillings and four pence halfpenny by the year of which sum of Three hundred and forty Eight pounds Seven Shillings and four pence halfpenny one half amounting to one hundred and Seventy four pounds Three Shillings, and Eight pence, Farthing by the year is due and payable to the Reverend John Macbeth as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Vicar of the said Parish and the other half amounting to one hundred and Seventy four pounds Three Shillings & Eight pence farthing by the Year is due and payable to John Love Esquire Lessee to the Vicars & Chairmen of the Cathedral Churches of Christ Church and Saint Patrick's Dublin, as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him and them as Owners of the Rectorial Tithes of said Parish And I do further Certify that the average price of Oats being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of Seven Years ending on the first day of November 1830 Thirty Six Twelve Shillings & and Eleven pence halfpenny per Barrel
