



John Plant Guyver Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by Virtue of an Act made in the 2nd & 3rd years of the Reign of King William the Fourth, entitled "An Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the 4th, 5th, and in the 7th & 8th years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth," providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Templeboden alias Dummagee in the County of Cork and Diocesis of Cloyne, do hereby certify, that the true and just amount of Compositions for all Tithes, whatever, within the said Parish is Three hundred and forty eight pounds seven shillings and four pence halfpenny by the year, of which sum of Three hundred and forty eight pounds seven shillings and four pence halfpenny, one half amounting to one hundred and seventy four pounds three shillings and eight pence farthing by the year is due and payable to the Reverend John Macbeth as a Composition for the Tithes Claimable by him as Vicar of said Parish, and the other half amounting to one hundred and seventy four pounds three shillings and eight pence farthing by the year, is due and payable to John Lorne Esquire Lessee to the Vicar and Choir men, of the Cathedral Church, of Christ Church, & Saint Patrick's, Dublin. And also Compositions for tithes claimable by him and them, as owners of the Rectorial Tithes of said Parish. And I do further certify that the average price of Oats being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November 1830 thirty is twelve shillings and eleven pence halfpenny per barrel.
