We Ralph Stoney and Thomas Hill, Commissioners for the Parish of Templemore  
being duly appointed and sworn under and by Virtue of an Act made in the fourth year  
of the reign of King George the fourth. entitled, 'An Act to provide for the Establishing  
of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time' do hereby certify that the true  
and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish, as  
mutually agreed on at Special Vestry is Ninety pounds Sterling, is due and payable  
to the Honourable & Rev. Arthur Vesey, as a Composition for the Tithes claimable  
by him as Rector & Vicar of said Parish, and we do further certify that the average  
price of Wheat, being the Corn principally grown in such County, for the  
period of seven years previous to and ending the first of November 1821  
is One pound eighteen Shillings & eight pence halfpenny  
Given under our Hands this 27<sup>th</sup> day of ~~October~~ <sup>September</sup> 1824
