We Ralph Stony and Tho^s Mill Commissioners duly
appointed and sworn Under and by Virtue of an Act
Made in the Fourth year of the Reign of King George the
Fourth Entitled an Act to provide for the Establishing
of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time
do Certify that the true and just amount of Composition
for all Tithes whatsoever within the Parish of Templedowny
as agreed upon at a Special Vestry held for that purpose
is Ninety pounds Annually which sum is due and
Payable to the Hon^{ble} and Rev^d Arthur Vesey as a Com-
position for the Tithes Claimable by him as Rector and
Vicar of said Parish And we do further Certify that
the Average price of Wheat being the Corn principally
grown in said County for the period of Seven years previous
to and ending on the first of November 1824 is One
pound eighteen Shillings and eight Pence half penny.

At a Vestry held on the 29th day of Sept^r 1824
in the Parish Church of Ballymore for the
Parish of Templedowny under the Act of Geo 1st Chap 29
and 5th of Geo 1st Chap 53 pursuant to notice & three
quarters by the Churchwardens of said Parish
eight persons admitted to votes being present the Rev^d
Wmth Howshaw was elected Chairman
The said Vestry do signify their assent to the
composition certified by the Commissioners for said
Parish of Templedowny as being of the acres
and surplus of land in said Parish and
also signify their consent that such composition
shall be invariable for the term of 21 years
from the first day of Nov^r next and that such
composition shall continue to be received for such
term of 21 years and shall not be subject
to any variation in the amount thereof
during such period of 21 years under the
provisions of the Act of Geo 1st Chap 29 and 5th of Geo
1st Chap 53 wherein the price of corn may be
