

We Richard Ryan and Charles Barry Commissioners,
duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue, of an
Act made in the Fourth year, of the Reign of King George
the Fourth, intituled "an Act to provide for the establishing
"of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, for a limited time,"
to ascertain and fix, a true and just composition for
all tithes, arising, growing, yielded, or payable within
the Parish of Templeshuran, in the County of Meath,
do hereby certify, that the true and just amount of
composition, for all tithes, whatever within the said
Parish, is one hundred and thirty pounds by the year,
— of which sum of one hundred and thirty pounds, the
whole is due and payable to the Reverend Stephen Radcliffe
as a composition for the tithe, claimable by him as Rector
of the said Parish. And we do further certify that the
average price of wheat being the Corn principally grown
in such County for the period of seven years ending
the 1st of November 1821 is one pound eighteen
shillings and eight pence half penny per Barrel. →
