

I John Edward Langford, having been appointed and sworn a Commissioner (under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and third years of the reign of King William the Fourth, to amend and make permanent three Acts made in the fourth, fifth, seventh and eighth years of the reign of King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Composition for Tithes in Ireland,) to ascertain and fix a true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielding or payable within the Parish of Templeendigan in the County of Wickford, and in the Diocese of Ferns,

I do Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for the Rectorial or Lay Impropriate Tithes in said Parish is One hundred and eighty eight pounds twelve Shillings and eight pence Sterling by the year (according to the average of the seven years preceding November One thousand eight hundred and thirty) and are due and payable in the following manner, vizt the sum of Sixty two pounds Seventeen Shillings and six pence two thirds to Denis McDonnell Esquire the sum of Sixty two pounds Seventeen Shillings and six pence two thirds to John McCarden Esquire M.D. and the sum of Sixty two pounds Seventeen Shillings and six pence two thirds to Edward Lewis Esquire, as a Composition for the Rectorial Tithes of said Parish claimed by them. And I do further Certify that the average price of Oats is twelve shillings and eleven pence half penny Sterling per barrel (as taken from the Dublin Gazette) for the seven years preceding November One thousand eight hundred and thirty being the Corn principally grown in this County.
