

I William Glennon Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the second and third years of the reign of King William the Fourth entitled an act to amend two acts, passed respectively in the Fourth Fifth and in the Seventh and Eighth years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth providing for the establishing of composition for Tithes in Ireland and to make such compositions permanent to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising growing yielding or payable within the Parish of Templemore in the Diocese of Meath and County of Mayo, do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes, whatever, within the said Parish, is One hundred and Eight Pounds, *£*80, of which sum of one hundred and Eight Pounds, one half part thereof, amounting to the sum of Fifty four Pounds *£*54, is due and payable to the Honorable and Reverend Dean Gore, as a Composition for the Tithes, claimable by him as the Rector of the said Parish and that the other half, Fifty four Pounds *£*54, is due and payable to the Reverend George Birmingham, as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him, as the Vicar of the said Parish.
