

Peace held on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of October  
1891. at Thurles in and for the said  
County and Diocese

Whereas by a Certificate  
in writing dated the 29<sup>th</sup> day of  
April 1828 and duly made signed  
and published by the Rev<sup>d</sup> William  
Kerthead, Falkner and Thomas  
Bennett the Commissioners duly  
appointed and sworn under  
and by virtue of an Act made in  
the fourth year of the reign of his  
former Majesty King George the  
fourth Chapter 99 and also under  
and by virtue of the 5<sup>th</sup> George  
the fourth Chapter 63 to amend  
the same to ascertain and fix  
a true and just composition for all  
Tithes arising growing yielded or  
payable within the parish of St  
Templmore in the Co. of Tipperary  
they the said Commrs did certify  
that the true and just amount  
of the Composition for all Tithes  
whatsoever in the said parish  
was £641 British by the year and  
that of that sum £420 British was

annually due and payable  
to John Heydel Esq. as Rector or  
impropriate of said parish and  
the sum of £221 British annually  
was due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup>  
Henry Muggs Graves the Vicar of  
said parish which sums of £420 to  
the Rector and of £221  
to the Vicar the said Commrs  
therein stated were certified by them  
in consequence of an Agreement  
made between the said Tithe Owners  
and a special vestry of said parish  
on the 14<sup>th</sup> of April 1828 to which  
Agreement the consent of his  
Grace the Archbishop of Cashel  
had been obtained

And the said Commrs  
further certified that the average  
price of wheat being the corn so  
principally grown in said Co  
for the period of 7 years ending  
the 1<sup>st</sup> Nov<sup>r</sup> 1821. was £1. 18<sup>..</sup> 8<sup>1/2</sup>  
late Irish Currency per Barrel
