

Peace held on the 17th day of October
1891 at Thurles in and for the said
County and District.

Whereas by a Certificate
in writing dated the 29th day of
April 1828 and duly made signed
and published by the Revd William
Kingsland Saltman and Thomas
Bennett the Commissioners duly
appointed and sworn under
and by virtue of an Act made in
the fourth year of the reign of his
former Majesty King George the
Fourth Chapter 99 and also under
and by virtue of the 5th George
the fourth Chapter 63 to amend
the same to ascertain and fix
a true and just composition for all
Tithes arising growing yielded or
payable within the parish of
Templemore in the Co of Tipperary
they the said Commiss^rs did certify
that the true and just amount
of the Composition for all Tithes
whatsoever in the said parish
was £641 13s 4d per year and
that of that sum £420 13s 4d was

annually was due and payable
to John Lloyd Esq^r as Rector or
improperly of said parish and
the sum of £221 British annually
was due and payable to the Revd
Henry Meggs Graves the Vicar of
said parish which sum of £420 to
the Rector Improvisator and £221
to the Vicar the said Commiss^r
therein stated were certified by them
in consequence of an Agreement
made between the said Sixte Owners
and a special vestry of said parish
on the 14th of April 1828 to which
Agreement the consent of his
Grace the Archb^tishop of Cashel
had been obtained

And the said Commiss^r
further certified that the average
price of wheat being the corn
principally grown in said Co
for the period of 9 years ending
the 1st Nov^r 1821 was £1. 18s 4d
