

We find the Parish of Limplying to contain
by our survey and estimate thereof, four thou-
sand and thirty one acres, one rood and thirty
two perches of arable and pasture land, together
with three thousand and forty five acres and
three roods of mountain land. We find that
of the above arable and pasture land, two
thousand two hundred and ninety four acres
one rood and fifteen perches, marked first
quality, and worth thirty shillings per acre,
shall pay the sum of one shilling and five
pence three farthings per acre, and so in pro-
portion for woods and perches as a composition
for the tithes thereof. And we find that seven
hundred and six acres, three roods and five
perches, marked second quality, and worth twen-
ty shillings per acre shall pay the sum of
twelve pence and one farthing per acre, and
so in proportion for woods and perches as a
composition for the tithes thereof. And we find
that one thousand and thirty acres, one rood
and twelve perches, marked third quality,

and worth ten shillings per acre shall pay
the sum of six pence, and so in proportion
for woods and perches, as a composition for the tithes
thereof. And finally, we find that three thou-
sand and forty five acres and three roods of
mountain above mentioned and worth one
shilling and six pence per acre shall pay
the sum of three half pence per acre and so
in proportion for woods and perches as a com-
position for the tithes thereof.

We certify that the above mentioned sums
paid out of the above mentioned quantity of
land makes the sum of two hundred and
fifty pounds per annum, being the sum
agreed on as a composition for the tithes of
said Parish. Given under our hands at
