We find the Parish of Tilkeade to contain by our Survey and estimation thereof Four thousand Four hundred and Twenty eight acres and eighteen Perches of which Three thousand nine hundred and thirty nine acres three Roods and one Perch are first quality and four hundred and eighty eight acres one Rood and Seventeen perches are second quality and it having been proposed at a meeting of the Inha-

bitants and Land Occupiers of said Parish held this day at the Church of Tilkeade pursuant to public notice in order to hear objections to this apportionment that an equal Cess should be put on and payable out of all the land in this Parish without taking the quality or value into consideration and the said proposition having been unanimously adopted, we the undersigned find that the sum of Shilling and nine pence and two thirds of a penny per acre and so in proportion for Roods and Perches makes the sum of Four hundred pounds per Annum being the sum agreed on as a composition for the Tythe of said Parish dated at Tilkeade the first day of Decemr 1824
