

Tithe Composition

I Joseph Henry Mybrants, having been duly appointed and sworn Commissioner under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth entitled an Act to provide for the establishing of compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time and by virtue of an Act passed in the second and third year of the Reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth entitled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth fifth and in the seventh and eight years of Reign of His late Majesty King George the fourth providing for the establishing of composition for Tithes in Ireland and to make such compositions permanent and to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Foran alias Templeoran in the county of Westmeath do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is One Hundred and Thirty seven Pounds Three Shillings By the year of which sum of £ 137.3.0 are due and payable to Sir John W. Peres Baronet as a composition for the Tithe claimable by him as Lay Impropriator

and I do further certify that the average price of oats being the commodity principally grown in such county for the period of seven years ending the first day of November 1830 is twelve Shillings and eleven pence half penny per barrel.
