I find for several of the Proprietors in this Parish that by reason of your refusal, to comply with the order of the Assistant Barrister, they are still obliged to pay the Rent Charge, without getting the benefit of that order, or the reduction directed thereby - I understood for sometime, that you felt some difficulty in making the calculations owing to the form of Certificate, that difficulty has been completely removed, as the calculation made out by Mr Sullivan was furnished to you by Mr Ball will prove - I assure you I write this to you in the most friendly spirit but on the contrary with feelings, the most friendly to you, I have got some blame for my clients, who have been for sometime urging me to take the necessary steps against you, to enforce compliance with the order of a Court having competent authority - I do not wish to appear in any way as proceeding against you - I have lost by my anxiety to save you from proceedings that will most certainly be taken, if you refuse to make the alterations, which are now quite simple - I ask you is it not fair to comply with the order of the Assistant Barrister if that order be illegal, let others take the necessary steps to set it aside and is it not much safer for you to comply with it, than to set yourself up as a Judge to question its legality - I will thank you to let me know what you intend to do, so that I may act accordingly
