Parish of Temple Quinlan

I John Kidd Commissioner duly appointed and  
sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the  
second and third years of the Reign of His Majesty  
King William the Fourth. Intituled "an act to amend  
three acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth and in  
the Seventh and Eighth years of the Reign of His Majesty  
King George the Fourth. Providing for the establishing of  
Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such  
permanant. 16 August 1832. To ascertain and fix  
a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing  
yielded or payable within the Parish of Temple Quinlan  
in the County of Cork. do hereby certify that the true and  
just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever  
within the said Parish is Two hundred and Thirty  
Pounds one Shilling and Eight pence Stg, by the year of  
which sum of Two hundred and Thirty ~~one~~ pounds one  
Shilling and Eight pence Stg. One half that is to say  
One hundred and Fifteen pounds, and Ten pence Stg.  
is due and payable to John Evans Lucas Esq<sup>r</sup> as Tenant  
for same under His Grace the Duke of Devonshire  
(The Impropriator of said Tithes being the Rectorial  
Tithes of said Parish) by virtue of a Lease granted by  
the then Duke of Devonshire to Thomas Lucas Esq<sup>r</sup> Grand-  
father of the aforesaid Tenant Dated 2<sup>nd</sup> May 1763  
for and during a term of three lives one of which namely  
Mary Croft alias Lucas is still in being The other  
half that is to say One hundred and Fifteen pounds  
and ten pence Stg. is due and payable to the Reverend  
Geo Armstrong as vicar of said Parish. And I do  
further certify that the average price of wheat  
during the seven years ended on the first Novr 1830  
was one pound Twelve Shillings and one half penny  
per Barrel and that the price of Oats during same period  
was Twelve Shillings and Eleven pence half penny  
per Barrel. wheat and Oats being the Corn principally  
grown in said County of Cork. Dated this Eleventh  
day of March 1834 = Four at Timoleague

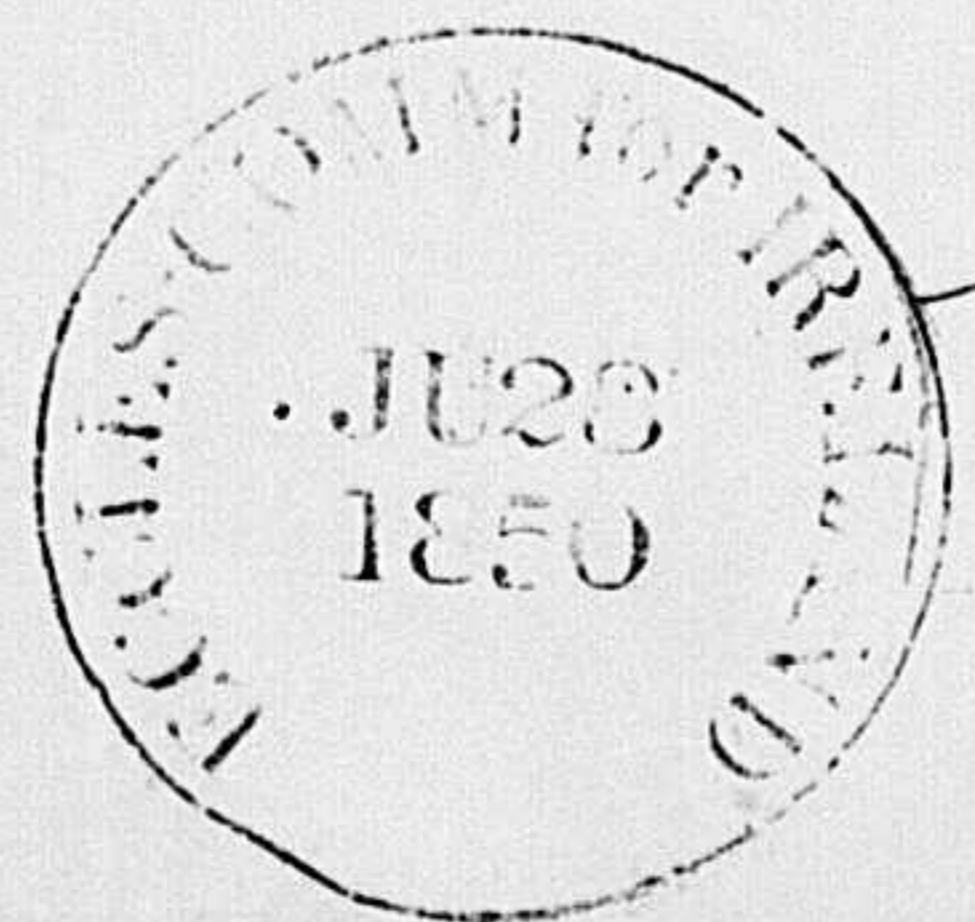
