I John Kidd Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the Second and Third years of the Reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth Entitled an Act to Amend three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth Fifth and in the Seventh and Eight years of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth providing for the Establishing of Composition for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent 16 August 1832 to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Templequinlan in the County of Cork do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Two Hundred and Thirty pounds One Shilling and eight pence Sterling by the year of which Sum of Two hundred and thirty pounds one Shilling and eight pence is to say one Hundred and fifteen pounds and Ten pence is due and payable to John Evans Lucas Esq: as Tenant for some under His Grace the Duke of Devonshire the Impropriator of said moiety being the Rectorial Tithes of said Parish by virtue of a lease granted by the then Duke of Devonshire to Thomas Lucas Grandfather of the said Tenant dated 2nd May 1763 for and during a term of three lives one of which namely Mary Crofts Alias Lucas is still in being the other half that is to say one Hundred and fifteen pounds and Ten pence is due and payable to the Reverend George Armstrong as Vicar of said Parish. And I do further Certify that the average price of wheat during the seven years ended 1st Nov: 1830 was One pound Twelve Shillings and one half penny of Banell ~~and oats~~ and that the price of oats during some periods was Twelve Shillings and Eleven pence half penny of Banell wheat and oats being the Corn principally grown in said County of Cork Dated at Bimoleague this Eleventh day of March 1834 Hour
