of Composition for Tythes in Ireland for a limited time
to ascertain and fix a true and Just composition for all
Tythes arising growing yielded or payable within the
Parish of Tomplerohin in the County of Cork. Diocese of
Cloyne do hereby Certify that the true and Just amount
of Composition for all Tythes whatever within said Parish
is Three Hundred and fifty Pounds by the year the whole
of which sum of Three Hundred and fifty Pounds is due
and payable to The Rev^d. Charles Archdeacon Warburton
as a Composition for all Tythes claimable by him as Rector
of said Parish - - - - -

And we do further certify that the said sum
of Three Hundred and fifty Pounds by the year is to
remain and continue as the true and Just amount
of composition for all Tythes claimable by him within
said Parish without variation for Twenty One years
from the first day of November next ensuing the
date hereof - whatever the price of Corn may be
Given under our hand this 7th day of August 1824
