

## NOTICE.

**COUNTY OF WATERFORD,** }  
*to wit.*

WHEREAS by an Applotment of Tithe Composition, bearing date the 30th day of December, 1833, and made by Thomas Edward Kiely, Esquire, a Commissioner then duly appointed for that purpose, the Lands of Ballyvoile, or a certain portion thereof, situate within the Parish of Stradbally, in the Diocese of Lismore, and said County of Waterford, were assessed and applotted with, and made subject to the payment of the annual Sums of £29 11s. 11*d.*, and £17 8s. 11½*d.*, making together the Sum of £47 0s. 10½*d.*, parcels of the Composition then duly ascertained and fixed as justly due and payable to His Grace The Most Noble William Spencer, Duke of Devonshire, as the Lay Impropiator, and the Rev. Doctor John Devereux, as Vicar thereof, for and in lieu of the Tithes of the said Parish of Stradbally, theretofore claimable by them thereout as such Lay Impropiator and Vicar respectively. And whereas by a subsequent decision and certain orders lately made in the High Court of Chancery of Ireland, in the Matter of the Petition of Henry Denny and others, touching the said Lands of Ballyvoile, the same Lands have been declared to be duly exempted from the payment of Tithes, and exonerated from liability to the above-mentioned Assessments or either of them. And the said Court of Chancery has also directed that said Applotment should be amended accordingly, without prejudice to the right of the said Duke of Devonshire to have a re-applotment of the said Sum of £29 11s. 11*d.*, Tithe Composition, made upon all the other Lands in the said Parish of Stradbally not Tithe free.

Now Notice is hereby given, that on *Saturday* the 20<sup>th</sup> day of *December 1856* or the first opportunity after, an application on behalf of His Grace the said Duke of Devonshire will be made to two or more Justices of the Peace of the said County of Waterford, assembled in Petty Sessions in and for the Dungarvan District of said County, at the Court-house of said District, then and there to proceed in pursuance of the provisions of the Act of the 4th George the 4th, chapter 99, section 35, to re-assess and re-applot the said Sums of £29 11s. 11*d.*, and £17 8s. 11½*d.*, making together the said Sum of £47 0s. 10½*d.*, so formerly assessed on such Lands of Ballyvoile so exempted, in proportion upon the occupiers of all the other Lands within such Parish of Stradbally, not being Tithe free, in the manner directed by the said Act, when and where all parties interested may attend if they shall think proper.
