duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the Fourth
Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth intituled (an act to provide for
the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time)
to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes
arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of
Temonfeckin, and County of Louth. Do hereby certify
that the true and just amount of composition for all Tithes
whatever within the said parish is Four hundred and thirty-
two pounds by the year ^{Ducam} payable to the Rev'd. John Kerr
as Rector of the said parish of Temonfeckin —

And we do further certify that the average
price of Wheat being the corn principally grown in that
county for the period of seven years ending the 1st of November
1821 is, (£1. 15.. 8 $\frac{3}{4}$) One pound eighteen shillings and eight
pence halfpenny Late Irish currency equal to £1. 15. 8 $\frac{3}{4}$
present currency per barrel
