Composition for all tithes whatever within the said
parish, is Four hundred and thirty two pounds by the
Year due and payable to the Rect^r. John Kerr as Rector
of the said parish of Termonfechin—

And we do further Certify that the
average price of Wheat being the Corn principally
grown in such County for the period of seven years
ending the 1st of Nov^r 1821 is (£ 1. 18. 8¹/₂) one
pound eighteen shillings and eight pence halfpenny
late Irish currency equal to £ 1. 15. 8³/₄ present
