

We, Michael Legge & Ralph Stoney, Commissioners duly appointed & sworn under & by virtue of an act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the Fourth, intituled "An act to provide for the establishment of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time", to ascertain & fix a true & just composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the parish of Tomyglap in the County of Tipperary, do hereby certify, that the true & just ~~Composition~~ of Composition for all tithes whatever within the said parish is Three Hundred & Twenty Five Pounds by the year: Of which sum of Three Hundred & Twenty Five Pounds. Two Hundred & Sixteen pounds, fifteen shillings, & four pence, are due & payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Rob<sup>t</sup>. M. Munt. as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by him as Rector of the said parish; & One Hundred & Eight Pounds, six shillings, & eight pence are due & payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> John Bayly, (Dean of Killaloe) the Vicar of said parish.

And we do further certify, that the average price of wheat, being the corn principally grown in such County, for the period of seven years, ending on the first day of November, 1821, is £ 1. 10. 8 1/2 per barrel.
