

Thomasstown October 14<sup>th</sup> 1833

I John Wickham, sole Commissioner duly appointed and sworn (under and by Virtue of an Act made in the 2<sup>d</sup> and 3<sup>d</sup> Year of His present Majesty William the 4<sup>th</sup> Cap 119 entitled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> and in the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the 4<sup>th</sup> providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent) do hereby certify that the true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever in the said Parish is Two hundred and forty eight Pounds 8<sup>19</sup> by the Year due and payable to The Rev Richard Cooke as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Rector of the said Parish -

And I do further certify that the Average Price of Wheat being the Corn principally grown in such County for the Period of seven Years ending on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1830 is L. 12.0<sup>2</sup> 1/2 J. P. Barrett
