owner of $\frac{2}{3}$ parts of the Lay or Impropriate
Tithes of said Parish that is to say of
all Tithes arising growing yielded
or payable in the several townlands
of Archerstown Cassestown Corbally
Dush Kile Knockroe Frighbeg and
Loonahoe within said Parish and
the sum of £45 sterling was due
and payable to Mrs Mary Downes
as owner of the other $\frac{1}{3}$ part of the
Lay or Impropriate Tithes of said
Parish that is to say of all Tithes
arising growing yielded or payable
in said townlands of Archerstown
Cassestown Corbally Dush Kile
Knockroe Frighbeg and Loonahoe
within said Parish and the said
Nicholas Manserph did further

Certify that the average price of

three or more persons in said Parish of
Thunders each charged with the
annual payment of £3 and upwards
in respect of the rent-charge now
payable in said Parish in lieu
of said Composition for Tithes caused
a notice in writing signed by them
to be affixed to the principal outer
door of the Church of said Parish
and also to the principal outer door
of every known place of Religion's
worship in said Parish on Sunday
the 20th day of September 1846 and
Sunday the 27th day of September 1896
