

I, Nicholas Mansergh the Commissioner duly appointed and sworn
(under and by virtue of an act made in the ^{second} Third year of the Reign of
King William the Fourth to amend three acts passed respectively in the
Fourth fifth and in the seventh and eighth years of his late Majesty
King George the Fourth providing for the establishing of composition for
tithes in Ireland and to make such compositions permanent) to ascertain
and fix a true and Just amount of composition for all tithes arising
growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Thules in the
County of Tipperary Do hereby Certify that the true and Just
amount of composition for all Tithes whatever within the said
Parish is Nine hundred and ninety five pounds Sterling by the
year of which sum of Nine hundred and ninety five pounds, the
sum of Eight hundred and sixty pounds Sterling are due and
payable to The Reverend Henry Cotton as a composition for the
Tithe claimable by him as Rector and Vicar of said Parish,
the sum of Ninety pounds Sterling is due and payable to
John Bagwell as owner of two thirds parts of the lay or impropriate
Tithes of said Parish, that is to say, of all tithes arising growing
yielded or payable in the several Townlands of Archerstown,
Capestown, Corbally, Drish, Kile, Knockroe, Loughbeg and
Toonahoe within said Parish, and the sum of Forty five pounds
Sterling is due and payable to M^{rs} Mary Downes as owner of the other
third part of the lay or impropriate tithes of said Parish, that is to
say, of all Tithes arising growing yielded or payable in these
Townlands of Archerstown Capestown, Corbally, Drish, Kile,
