

I James Barry a Commissioner duly appointed and Sworn under and by Virtue of an Act made in the Second and Third year of the Reign of King William the Fourth intituled an Act to amend Three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth Fifth and in the Seventh and Eighth years of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth providing for the Establishing of Composition for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Composition permanent to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing yielding or payable within the following Townlands viz Ballyboggan Castlesow and Chandalls Mill which comprise that part of the Parish of Tichillon of the Union of Ardara in the Diocese of Down and County of Wexford of which the Rev. John W. Stokes is Ecclesiastical Incumbent or Vicar. I do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the above named said part of said Parish is Twenty eight Pounds Twelve shillings and Ten pence Sterling by the year according to the average of the seven years preceding November 1830 of which sum Twenty nine pounds Nineteen shillings and four pence are due and payable to the Rev. John W. Stokes as Composition for the Tithes claimed by him as Vicar of the said part of said Parish and the sum of Twenty eight pounds Nineteen shillings and six pence to The Earl of Downmouth as a Composition for the Tithes claimed by him as Lay Proprietor of said part of said Parish. And I do hereby certify that the average price of Oats being the corn principally grown in ^{said} County for the period of seven years ending on the first day of Nov^r 1830 is Oats Twelve shillings and Eleven pence Half penny Sterling per Barrel
