Do hereby Certify that the true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever, within the said Parish, is *One Hundred and Twenty One Pounds Seven Shillings, Six Pence* by the Year, according to the best information I could receive of the *Surveys* for the *Seven Years* preceding *1830* of which Sum *Sixty Three Pounds Seven Shillings, Six Pence* is due and payable to the *Earl of Portsmouth* as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by *him* as *Lord Proprietor* of said Parish and the Sum of *Sixty Pounds* Standing to the *Rev. Samuel J. [unclear]* as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by *him* as *Vicar* of said Parish

And I do hereby Certify that the average price of *Oats* being the Corn principally grown in ~~the~~ *Said County* for the period of Seven Years, ending on the 1st day of November, 1830, is *Twelve Shillings and Sixpence* per Barrel.
