

I, ARTHUR MOORE MOSSE, being duly Appointed and Sworn Commissioner, under and by virtue of an act made in the Second and Third Years of the Reign of King WILLIAM the Fourth, Chapter 119, entitled an act to amend Three Acts passed respectively in the 4th, 5th 7th and 8th years of the Reign of his late Majesty, King GEORGE the Fourth, providing for the Establishment of Composition of Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent (16th August, 1833,) to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes Arising, Growing, Yielding, or Payable within the Parish of

Timogue in the Queen's County, do certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever in said Parish is ~~£100 and fifty eight pence and nine shillings~~ ^{£100 and fifty eight pence and nine shillings}, by the year, and that the said Sum of ~~£100 and fifty eight pence and nine shillings~~ ^{£100 and fifty eight pence and nine shillings} is payable to the Rev. *Thomas J. Townsend*. as a Composition for all Tithes, claimed by him as Rector of said Parish of *Timogue*

And I further certify that the average amount paid or agreed for for the parish of Timogue for seven years ending 1st November 1830 is One hundred and thirty two pounds nine shillings, and nine pence half penny, to which I have added a sum of Twenty six pounds nine shillings, and eleven pence half penny, and I further certify I have added same having proof before me that the sum paid for such parish for six years ending 1st November 1829, was not adequate compensation for the Tithes of said
