Do hereby Certify that the true and just Compensation
for all Tithes whatsoever within the said parish is
Four Shillings and Sixpence per Acre Eight Shillings
and Eight pence halfpenny Sterling per Acre by the
year of wheat from the Cultivator and one shilling
and sixpence per Acre from the Cultivator as the prebendary
and vicar of the said parish And we do further
certify that the average price of wheat being the
best principally grown in that County for the
period of seven years ending the first day of November
1821 is one pound Eighteen Shillings and Eight pence halfpenny
sterling late Irish Currency per Acre Dated this 28th
day of January 1828
