 equity and Good conscience, and without favour
 or affection prejudice or malice to any person
 or persons whatsoever -

And we do further Swear that
 we and each of us are possessed of a clear personal
 Estate of One thousand pounds over and above
 all our just Debts and Incumbrances -

 Under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year
 of the Reign of King George the fourth Entitled An
 Act to provide for the Establishing of Compositions for
 Tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain
 and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes
 arising growing yielded or payable within the
 Parish of Rathfriland in the County of Wick -
 Do hereby certify that the true and
 just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever
 within the said Parish is Fifty two pounds ten Shillings
 by the year, of which sum of Fifty two pounds ten
 Shillings one third part is due and payable to The
 Rev^d Latham Goddington as Composition for Tithes
 claimable by him as Rector Incumbent of said Parish
 and two thirds is due and payable to the Minor
 Canons of Christ Church and St. Patrick's Dublin
 as Rectors of said two thirds -

And we do further certify that the
 Average price of Wheat being the Corn principally
 grown in said County for the period of Seven years
 Ending on the first of November, One thousand
 Eight hundred and Twenty one, is Five pounds
 fifteen Shillings and Eight pence Half penny of Paris
