 equity and Good Conscience and without favour
 or affection prejudice or malice to any person or
 persons whatsoever —

And we do further Swear that
 we and each of us are possessors of a clear
 personal Estate and property of One thousand
 pounds over and above all our just Debts
 and Incumbrances. —

We The Rev^d John Hardy and
 Mr James Gray Commissioners duly Appointed and
 Sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the
 fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth
 entitled an Act to provide for the Establishing of
 Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time
 to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for
 all Tithes arising growing due or payable within
 the Parish of Timolin in the County of Wexford —

Do hereby certify that the true and
 just amount of composition for all Tithes whatever
 within the said Parish is One hundred and ninety
 One pounds five Shillings by the year, of which sum
 of One hundred and ninety One pound five Shillings
 One third part is due and payable to The Rev^d Sathan
 Adington as composition for Tithes claimable by him
 as Vicar incumbent of said Parish and two thirds is
 due and payable to the Vicars and Messrs Canons
 of Christ Church and St. Patrick's Dublin as owners
 of said two thirds —

And we do further certify that the
 average price of Wheat being the corn principally
 grown in the County for the period of seven years
 ending on the first of November One thousand
 Eight Hundred and Twenty One, is One pound
 fifteen Shillings and Eight pence half penny of
 the said —
